Javier San Pedro Ortega is a fifth-generation farmer and winemaker in Laguardia, the Rioja Alavesa's most emblematic village. Rather than wait to take the reins of his family's winery, he decided in 2014 to strike out on his own with nothing more than a bank loan and some inherited vineyards. Javier's entry level white is crafted to appease a more youthful crowd, featuring a a clean, crisp, and modern style. The level of precision and clarity brought out in the Viura is a remarkable testament to Javier's winemaking prowess.

Variety: 100% Viura

Vineyard: The vineyards are sourced largely in Rioja Alavesa, near the Sierra de Cantabrian Mountains. Average vine age is around 20 years.

Winemkaing: Fermented and aged in stainless steel

Alcohol: 13%

VINTAGE

A cool but also dry year, with even and balanced ripening. September rain provided relief to most parts of Rioja.

Ripe yellow peach and freshly squeezed lemon juice, with a crisp and almost saline structure.
